Henrietta Vander Hart went to be with her Lord and Savior on Sunday, Sept. 22, 2024, at the age of 97 years, while being cared for at The Cottages in Pella.

Funeral services were held Friday, Sept. 27, at Faith Christian Reformed Church in Pella. Interment was at Oakwood

Cemetery, Pella.

Henrietta, the oldest of four children, was born to Henry and (Hoksbergen) Magdalene Roozeboom on July 11, 1927, near Harvey. She lived in the Harvey and Tracy areas. attending country schools through the eighth grade, and she made her profession of faith at the Tracy Christian Reformed Church in 1944. After grade school, she worked in the neighboring homes with new mothers and general house-keeping, until 1948, when she worked at a Pella café and met Paul Vander Hart. On Feb. 16, 1949, Henrietta married Paul Hugo Vander Hart, became a mother to his two-year daughter, Linda Kay, and they were blessed with four children: Gary Wayne, Bonnie Mae, Debra Elaine, and Bradley Paul.

Henrietta and Paul were able to work many of their employment jobs together. They operated a florist and greenhouse nursery in Newton and then managed the Dutch Buffet and Roller Rink in Pella. After also working at Van Sittert Fabrics, Henrietta finished her employment at Pella Corp,

retiring after 18 years.
