
## **Phillip Stanley Grier**

Phil Grier, 93, of Montezuma, passed away Wednesday evening, Nov. 27, 2024, at Brooklyn Community Estates. Funeral services were Monday, Dec. 2, at the Holland-Coble Funeral Home in Montezuma. Phillip Stanley Grier, the son of Benton and Elizabeth (Fogle) Grier, was born on Nov. 28, 1930. He was raised in the Deep River/ Dresden area. At a young age, Phil's dad would send him and his brother to town where Phil would buy fudge every time, therefore everyone in town starting calling him "Fudge," and that nickname stuck throughout his life. On Jan. 1, 1950, Phil was united to the love of his life, Elizabeth "Betty" Strausser. To this union, three children were born, Diane, Dixie, and David. They lived in the Deep River area, where he worked for various farmers. Several years later, they purchased a farm north of Guernsey and they farmed, milked cows, and he worked the night shift at Amana.

In the mid 1960s, Fudge and Betty purchased a welding/ blacksmith shop in Montezuma, running it for several years before working for John Deere and International in Montezuma and Brooklyn. Thev eventually purchased a farm west of Montezuma, where Phil went back to farming while working in town. When Phil finally gave up his job in town, he was able to concentrate on farming full time and helping his son, Dave, farm for many years. After Betty passed away in 1999, Phil met his dear friend, Carolyn Woods. Phil enjoyed playing cards, farming, spending time with his family, and square dancing with his wife, Betty.
