Louise Doonan 99, of Pella, died Wednesday, Dec. 25, 2024, at the Cottages in Pella. She was born Feb. 20, 1925, on a farm near Lynnville, the daughter of Homer and Zella Kirby Briggs. She graduated from New Sharon High School with the Class of 1941. Following graduation, she took Normal training to become a teacher. She started teaching country school at Mill Grove country school for four years and then went to work for Barnes City Public School, where she taught for three years. On June 1, 1947, she was united in marriage to (Robert) Dean Doonan. To this union, three daughters were born, Marcia, Virginia, and Debra. Early on, Louise dedicated her time to caring for her family and home. As her daughters reached school age, she went to work with Dean at Doonan Insurance and Real Estate in Montezuma.
