
Lowell Thomas Hockett



Lowell Thomas Hockett, age 84, of Sarasota, Florida, and Franklin, North Carolina, passed away March 2. Preceding him in death were his parents, Norman and Gladys Hockett, of Grinnell, Iowa, additionally his older brother Robert of Ann Arbor, Michigan. He was born on August 14, 1940, in Grinnell, Iowa. Lowell, a lifelong academic, graduated from Grinnell High School ('58), Grinnell College ('62), and received advanced education at the University of Iowa where in back-to-back years he received both his Masters ('65) and Education Specialist ('66) Degrees.

He served as Principal at schools in Ames, Iowa, Zion, Illinois, and Kirkwood, Missouri. Most of his years were spent at Phillippi Shores and he finally retired in 2003. After his retirement, he would gladly fill in for his principal colleagues in their times of need.

Lowell was multiple time Mid-Western golf conference medalist which proved his status as a player among the four included states. Post-graduation, Lowell was a reigning Grinnell Country Club Champion from the years 1963-1965. Lowell played golf well into his later years where he would never turn down another round or another bet.

His greatest joys in life were his grandchildren, Taylor who is a social worker, TJ who is a senior at Florida State University, and Austin who is a junior at Riverview High School. Lowell is survived by his wife, Judie, younger brother Edwin, and two sons Eric and Chad, both of Sarasota. Lowell leaves behind his sister-in-law, Diane Hockett of Ann Arbor, MI, and numerous nieces and nephews.
