
Obituary

Sylvia was united in marriage with Clarence Renaud on November 17, 1939 in Marshalltown, Iowa. They became the parents of three daughters and three sons. Except for two years spent in Phoenix, Arizona, she was a lifelong resident of the Lynnville-Sully area.

She went to her eternal home on Monday evening, January 14, 2008 at the Pella Regional Health Center – Long Term Care at the age of nine-ty-three years, seven months, and twenty-seven days.

Sylvia accepted Christ as her Savior as a young woman, and lived a life of faithfulness to Him. She was a member of the Sully Community Church where she served in many capacities. She had the privilege of leading several of her children to the Lord.

Music was the joy of her life and hospitality was her hallmark. She set a beautiful table, often including fresh flowers from her garden. She loved baking and preparing meals to share with her family and friends.
