

Arlene Scott, 90

Arlene Hazel Scott, 90, a longtime resident of Brooklyn, died Tuesday, Jan. 1, 2008, at Brooklyn Community Estate, Brooklyn.

Funeral services for Arlene Scott were held at 2 p.m. on Saturday, Jan. 5, at Grace United Methodist Church, Brooklyn. The Rev. John Dodd officiated, and the organist was Marilyn Kriegel.
