The couple made their hopies in Chicago; then in Tennessee, where their daughter, Barbara Ann, was born in August 1942. After Kenneth joined the U.S. Navy in November, Lucille moved with their infant daughter back to Hartwick, then to Belle Plaine, where the two lived until they were reunited with Kenneth in 1946.

The family moved to Hartwick, where Kenneth took a position at Hartwick State Bank. Lucille taught school part-time, and later, joined Ken in the bank, where she held several positions before becoming vice president, and then director, holding the latter title until the time of her death.

A son, James Benjamin, was born to Lucille and Ken in Hartwick. Lucille's skill at combining motherhood, work, and community involvement, was honed as Ken became busy in public service, often away from home during his tenures as Iowa Department Commander of the American Legion, and Iowa State Senator. When he became president of the Independent Bankers Association of America in 1975, Lucille participated fully by planning and speaking at events for spouses, and enjoyed the opportunity to travel throughout the country.

After making their home in Hartwick for 28 years, Ken and Lucille moved to Grinnell in 1974. In addition to her professional work, Lucille became active in Grinnell in the UCC Church, P.E.O. Chapter BM, Drummond Club, and served in several volunteer roles in the community.
