August Albert DeLoof, 92

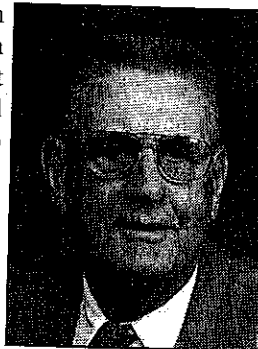
