

MILDRED ADAMS

Mrs. Mildred Adams, 87, of Denver, Col., a former resident of Brooklyn, died March 4 in Mercy Medical Center, Denver. Graveside services for Mrs. Adams were held March 7 at the Brooklyn Cemetery. Rev. James B. Rea, Pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Brooklyn, officiated. The Nevenhoven Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements.

Avis Mildred McCluskey Adams, widow of the late James B. Adams, daughter of John and Ellen Wylie McCluskey, was born Dec. 22, 1904 in Brooklyn.
