

Lloyd Adamson Rites Tuesday

Lloyd B. Adamson, 69, of Kellogg died Saturday evening at his home of an apparent heart attack.

The son of William H. and Josephine I. Reynolds Adamson, he was born Jan. 13, 1904, in Cincinnati, Iowa. He attended the public schools in that community and later came to the Kellogg and Newton area. He had been associated with the Maytag Company in Newton and the Midwest Manufacturing Company in Kellogg, and had made his home in Kellogg the past 20 years. Mr. Adamson had served with the U.S. Army during World War II and was a member of Kellogg American Legion Post No. 355.

Survivors include two nieces, Mrs. Fred (Sue) Baker of Grinnell and Mrs. Joe (Shirley) Kocyon of Gardena, Calif.; one grand niece and two grand nephews, Marcia, Wayne, and Charles Baker of Grinnell; and a sister-in-law, Mrs. Carl (Sophia) Adamson of Grinnell. He was preceded in death by his parents, and three brothers and one sister—Mrs. Hugh (Hazel) Dinning, Carl R. Adamson who died in 1957, and Robert and John Adamson who died in infancy.

Funeral services for Mr. Adamson will be held at 1 p.m. Tuesday at the Kellogg Methodist Church, with Bob Hinshaw, pastor of the Ashton Chapel Church at Baxter, officiating. Organist will be Mrs. Willard Heffner. Honorary pallbearers will be Wallace L. Braley, Walter Durkee, Clarence Hammer, Bob Herman, Lloyd Stanley, and Ray Welle.

Burial will be in the Evergreen Cemetery at Cincinnati.
