Frances Wolcott Anderson, 94, of the Mayflower Home died Wednesday, Oct. 23, at the Mayflower Health Care Center.

A memorial service was conducted Monday in Denison Chapel of the Mayflower Home, with the Rev. Michael Smith, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Grinnell, and the Rev. Daniel Ogata of Grinnell officiating. Pianist was Norman Goodbrod. Vocalist was Marvin Kelley, accompanied by Mary Ogata.

Following cremation, graveside services will be conducted at 1:30 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 31, at Golden Prairie Cemetery near Ryan.

The daughter of Frank L. and Minerva Taylor Clark, she was born July 3, 1897, near Manchester. She was a graduate of Manchester High School and Grinnell College and did graduate work at the University of Iowa. She taught drama and English in high schools at Strawberry Point and Manchester.

She was married to William N. Wolcott in Manchester. Following Mr. Wolcott's death, she was married to Harold C. Anderson May 1, 1948, in Manchester. The couple spent several years under the Presbyterian Board of Foreign Missions, preaching and teaching in Brazil. Following their retirement, they returned to Manchester. Following her husband's death, Mrs. Anderson moved to the Mayflower Home.

She was a member of the First Presbyterian Church, and while living in Manchester she was a member of the board of education. She was also a member of PEO, the DAR, the Iowa Poetry Day Association, the Iowa Federation of Women's Clubs, the Audubon Society, Phi Delphian and the Delaware County Choral Society.

There are no immediate survivors. She was preceded in death by her parents and both husbands.
