

## J. E. Anderson Funeral Is Held In Kellogg Wed.

Kellogg, Ia., August 6, Special: Graveside rites for J. E. Anderson, former Kellogg resident who died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Della Redfield at Boone, Iowa, Monday afternoon, July 29, were held in Our Silent City Wednesday afternoon at 4:00 o'clock with Rev. Albert S. Kilbourn, pastor of the Congregational church in Eagle Grove in charge. Burial was made in the family lot.

Mr. Anderson was born in Jesup, Iowa, April 25, 1866, the son of J. H. and Adeline Cameron Anderson. He came to Kellogg when he was about twenty-five years of age and operated a barber shop here for eight years. He was united in marriage to Miss Mattie Adkins of this place February 24, 1892 and three children were born of this union two of whom survive. The mother passed away January 13, 1907, at Boulder, Colorado, where the family had gone because of her failing health and a son, Dorr, died at the home of his sister in Boone in 1927.

He moved to Grinnell in 1900 and was in business there for a period of five years, then went to Eagle Grove where he had been associated with his brother, A. M. Anderson, under the firm name of Anderson Brothers for the past 30 years. He was married a second time to Miss Molly Snyder of Grinnell March 22, 1909, and she died July 26, 1913. Three years later he married Miss Mary Spears of Eagle Grove who preceded him in death April 28, 1934.

He was a loyal member of Golden Links lodge No. 68, I. O. O. F., of Eagle Grove, and of the Eagle Grove Gun club.

Surviving relatives include his two children, Mrs. Della Redfield of Boone, and Byford Anderson of Madrid; five brothers, Jesse E., of Oakdale, California, A. M., of Eagle Grove, Fred H. of Arnold, Nebraska, Roy D., of Oelwein, Iowa, and Owen C., of Chemeketa Park, Alma, California; three sisters, Mrs. Mary Minton and Mrs. C. H. Holton of Fairbank, Iowa, and Mrs. J. E. Murphy of Waterloo, Iowa; four grandchildren, Helen Redfield Daklin, Glen, Charles, and Doris Redfield, all of Boone; and two great-grandchildren, Billie and Clavonne Daklin of Boone.
