Anna Lee Ashing, 75, of Grinnell, the widow of Ira O. Ashing, died early Saturday, Apr. 27, at Grinnell General Hospital.

The daughter of George W. and Lizzie Edmundson Guynn, she was born Dec. 28, 1898, in Licking, Mo. In 1900, she moved with her family to Coweta, Okla., where she attended the Indian Territory School.
