## An Old Timer Dies

All old timers remember the W. S. Bailey family who lived northeast of town many years. A son, Millard Fillmore recently died. His death is reported in the Mitchell Gazette.

"M. F. Bailey, a resident of Mitchell for the past 29 years, died at his home Sunday night. Heart trouble and other diseases have kept Mr. Bailey ill for the past two years. Funeral services were held in the Methodist church Tuesday afternoon at 3 o'clock with Rev. Mr. Swisher officiating.
