

W. L. H. Baker, 73 Passes Away In Springdale, Ark.

The many Grinnell friends of Elder W. L. H. Baker will regret to learn of his death at Springdale, Ark., Feb. 3, after a very brief illness, at the age of 73 years. Death was caused by heart failure.

The burial service was held at the Adventist church and conducted by Elder Hartwell of Rogers, Ark. The hymns used at this service were "Asleep in Jesus," "Sweet Be Thy Rest," and "Gleams of the Golden Morning." Burial was at Bluff cemetery, Springdale, Arkansas.

Elder Baker was the only son of "Uncle Peter" and "Aunt Cynthia" Baker who spent the later years of their life at their home in south Grinnell, Iowa, and who were largely instrumental in the building and support of the Adventist church here.

Both Elder Baker and his wife spent thirty-four years serving as missionaries of the Adventist Church in Australia, returning to the United States about ten years ago, where they have never ceased their efforts in such work, he being chaplain of their church hospital at Colorado Springs, Colo., until their removal to Springdale in search of a climate more conducive to good health.

Mr. Baker was born at his parents' home about seven miles west of Grinnell, where he lived until he began his education and training for his chosen life work to which he devoted his entire time and energy.

He leaves surviving him his wife, a son, Dr. H. M. Baker, and daughter, Mrs. Enid Cantoreggi, both of Boston, Mass.
