Young Wife And Mother Is Mourned (THOMAS BARNS)

Mrs. Hazel Alley Barns Was Buried Wednesday.

Vera Hazel, fourth daughter of Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Alley, was born at Sheridan, Iowa, July 28th, 1893 and died at the home of her sister, Mrs. C. J. Turner Denison, Iowa, after a short illness from appendicitis and peritonitis, February 17, 1925 at the age of 31 years and 7 months. Two children have blessed the home of Mr. and Mrs. Barns, Mary Eleanor, aged 8 and Thomas Roger aged 7. These with their father are mourning the loss of one who never can be replaced. Mrs. Barns was a member of the Methodist church in Pomeroy, Iowa, near their home in Knoke.
