Passed Away at Home of Her Daughter, Mrs. J. S. Nollen.

Mrs. Edward O. Bartlett, born Providence, R. L., Jan. 1, 1846; died Grinnell, Iowa, July 25, 1923.

Mrs. Bartlett was the youngest daughter of Amos · C. Barstow, prominent citizen of Providence, at one time Mayor of the city, one of the first members of the American Boara of Commissioners for Foreign Missions, generous giver to the Congregational Church and to Western colleges; close personal friend of Henry Ward Beecher, Dwight L. Moody, and President Magoun of Grinnell College. She was married in 1869 to the Rev. Edward Otis Bartlett, chaplain during the Civil War, pastor of Congregational churches at Providence, Pittsfield and Lynnfield, Mass., and Kingston, R. I. who died in 1909. Though living during the past twelve years with her daughter at Lake Forest, Illinois, and Grinnell, she retained her membership in the Central Congregational Church of Providence; she was the oldest Vice President of the Women's Board of Rhode Island.

Mrs. Bartlett is survived by five sons and a daughter; Josiah, of Roland Park, Maryland; Edward O., of Florence, Italy; Dwight K., of Providence; Louise, wife of Dean John S. Nollen of Grinnell College; Clarence B., of Milwaukee; and LeRoy, of Berkeley, California.
