Dr. F. Baumann Dies; Memorial Services July 5

Dr. Frederick L. Baumann, 77, professor emeritus of history at Grinnell College, died of a heart attack, early Friday morning at a local hospital.

Dr. Baumann was born Aug. 28, 1889 in Elgin, Ill., and was grad-

uated from high school there in 1911. He received his Ph. B. degree in 1917 and his M.A. degree in 1924, both from the University of Chicago, and his Ph.D. degree in 1929 from Cornell University.

He had been a member of the Grinnell College faculty since 1927 and became professor emeritus of history in 1954. After 1954 he continued to teach part time until 1963.

Before coming to Grinnell, Dr. Baumann taught at Franklin College and Carleton College. He served in World War I as an ambulance driver with the U.S. S.A.C., attached to the Italian Army and was decorated for his services.

He was a member of Phi Beta Kappa and several professional associations. He authored a number of articles for professional journals.

Survivors include his wife, the former Faye Bennett; one son, Victor H. Bauman of Tempe, Ariz.; four grandchildren; two great-grandchildren; and one brother, Ray Bowman of Brooklyn, N.Y.

Memorial services will be held at 2 p.m., Wednesday, July 5, at Herrick Chapel on the Grinnell College Campus. Professor Howard Burkle will officiate at the services.

In lieu of flowers, friends are asked to make memorial contributions to a book fund for Stewart and Burling Libraries.

Memorial services were held Wednesday afternoon in Herrick Chapel for Frederick L. Baumann, professor emeritus of history at Grinnell College, who died Friday morning.

Others taking part in the service were Joseph F. Wall, Parker professor of history and chairman of the faculty; Dr. Baumann's son, Victor H. Baumann of Tempe, Ariz.; and a nephew, Peter A. Bowman, who will join the Grinnell physics faculty this fall.
