The family have made their home in Grinnell, where he has been employed in various capacities.

"Jack," as he was familiarly known among us, was an industrious, likeable fellow, and the members of the community as well as his fraternal brothers in the Woodman and Eagle lodges, very much regret his passing: his family and relatives have our sympathy in this, their hour of sorrow.

The funeral was held Tuesday afternoon, from the Friends church, with Rev. O. L. Hutchins preaching the ceremony. Interment was in Hazelwood cemetery.

The scripture reading was Psalms 90:1-12 and the text was Psalms 61:2. The songs that were sung were "Abide With Me," "He Knows" and "Rock of Ages."
