Mrs. Beeler Killed By Cars

Is Struck By Train No. 7 On Rock Island Sunday Eve-

DEATH IS THOUGHT TO
HAVE BEEN INSTANTANEOUS.

Funeral Will Be At 2:30 Thursday Afternoon From Baptist Church.

While walking on the Rock Island track Sunday evening just on the west edge of town Mrs. Isabel Beeler was struck by Rock Island train Number Seven and instantly killed.

Isabel Jenkins was born Oct. 17. 1862, in Washington twp, this county. She was the daughter of Nehemiah and Angeline Jenkins who came to this county from Indiana and settled in Washington township in 1849.

The father was a native of Morgantown, Va., and the mother Angeline Hibbs was born at Williamsburg, Ind. The daughter was educated in the country schools and on Dec. 28, 1881, was united in marriage with Frederic V. Beeler. Two children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Fred Beeler, Mary A., later married to George Manor. She died a few years ago; and Nellie D., the wife of Floyd Breeden of Greeley, Colo.

Mrs. Beeler and her grand daughter, Mildred Manor, have been living together at 929 High Street.

The death was witnessed by a small son of Mr. and Mrs. Wm Stewart who says that she stepped off the track when the train neared her, but evidently became confused and stepped back just in front of the engine. The blow must have killed her instantly.

Mrs. Beeler was a quiet, attractive woman with many friends who regret her death
