## Rites Tuesday for Victor Boy Killed in Tractor Mishap

Funeral rites were conducted about 6 p.m. Saturday near the at St. Bridget's Catholic church in Victor, Thursday morning for Bruce Joseph Beran, 16-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Beran, who was killed Saturday in a tractor accident.
