Mrs. George Billick of Solana Beach, Calif., mother of Mrs. C.J. Sutphin of Brooklyn, died Tuesday of last week in a hospital at San Diego, Calif. following an illness of a few weeks. She was 76 years old.

Funeral services were conducted here Monday afternoon at two o'clock at the C.J. Sutphin home in charge of the Rev. C.W. Woollard, pastor of Grace Methodist church.
