

Doris Bouma services set

Doris M. Bouma, 50, died Thursday afternoon in Chope Community Hospital in San Mateo, Calif., of a stroke suffered at her home.

Funeral services will be held at 3:30 p.m. Tuesday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Philip J. Ramstad, pastor of the United Church of Christ-Congregational, officiating. Organist will be Norman Goodbrod, and pallbearers will be Robert Henderson, Clair Hutchison, Robert Maring, Charles Ruth, Carroll Stuart and Charles Ziegenmeyer. Graveside services will be held at 1 p.m. Wednesday at the City Cemetery in Freeport, Ill.

Miss Bouma was the daughter of Mrs. Margery W. Bouma of the Mayflower Home and Robert T. Bouma who died March 12, 1975. She was born April 3, 1925, at Hampton.

While she was young, she moved with her family to Grinnell, graduating from Grinnell High School with the class of 1943. While in high school she was president of the YWCA and was active in the Girls Glee Club and Mixed Chorus.

Following high school she attended Lesley College in

Cambridge, Mass., and Jackson College, affiliated with Tufts University at Medford, Mass. She also worked for the FBI for a few years before making her home on the West Coast. In recent years she was an assistant to the guidance director in the office of admissions at the College of San Mateo in California.

She is survived by her mother, Margery; her two brothers, Robert W. Bouma of Jemez Pueblo, N.M., and Richard B. Bouma of Omaha, Neb.; and a sister, Mrs. Royai Jean Ruth of Edmonton, Alberta, Canada.
