Frank W. Bradley.

Frank W. Bradley, son of Wilber and Rosa Bradley, was born near Guernsey, Iowa, December 17, 1887, and died May 24, 1917, at Fort Bliss, Texas. Soon after moving to Grinnell in 1908 or 1909, he joined the militia, and in 1911 he joined the regular army. In a short time he left for the Philippine Islands, where he served three years in Company B, 13th Infantry. After an honorable discharge, he re-enlisted and had served as sergeant of Company D, 7th Infantry on the border for two years and four months, when he was taken ill with scarlet fever. On Thursday, May 24, word came of his death. On January 24, 1917, he was united in marriage to Miss Mary Smith, of El Paso, Texas. Besides his wife he leaves to mourn his loss his mother, Mrs. Rosa Bradley, of this city, two brothers, five sisters, his grandmother, and many sincere friends. His body was brought to Grinnell last Sunday and interment was in Hazelwood cemetery.
