

Rites Held For Cecil Brannian, Brooklyn Farmer

Funeral services for Cecil Brannian, Brooklyn area farmer who died suddenly Sunday evening following a heart attack, were held Wednesday at the Grace Methodist church, Brooklyn.

Officiating was the Rev. M. C. Shupe, pastor of the church. Burial was in the I.O.O.F. cemetery at Brooklyn.

Born in Poweshiek county on Dec. 10, 1893, he was the son of John and Laural Johnston Brannian. On Jan. 14, 1920, he was united in marriage with Eva Fraser. With the exception of time spent in the armed services during World War I, his entire life was spent in Poweshiek county.

He was preceded in death by his parents, three sisters, and four brothers.
