

Mrs. Bridges dies in Tennessee

Margaret Bridges, 85, of Tuilahoma, Tenn., formerly of Grinnell died of a stroke March 22 at the Life Care Center in Tuilahoma.

Funeral services were held March 24, with burial at Rose Hill Memorial Gardens in Tuilahoma.

She was born March 22, 1898, the daughter of Charles E. and Sarah Turner Adkins. She was married to Lee Bridges, who died in January 1980.

While in Grinnell, she was active in Eastern Star. She had worked for the telephone company and the Railway Express Co. She attended schools in Grinnell and was a graduate of Grinnell High School.

Mrs. Bridges was also active

in church work, the Women's Club and the Eastern Star in Tuilahoma.

She is survived by a son, James, and a daughter, Barbara, both of Nashville, Tenn.; two grandchildren; a sister, Mima Guthrie of Culver City, Calif.; and two brothers, Roy Adkins of Searsboro and Lloyd Adkins of Riverside, Calif.
