Frances Henriette Adelheide Broders, old time resident of Poweshiek county, Ia., was born Feb. 5, 1835, at Forste, Germany. In 1856 she came to America with her father and two brothers and was united in marriage to August Wanner who died of wounds received in the battle of Champion Hill, Miss., May 5, 1863. To this union were born Mrs. Caroline Mehlin, deceased, Mrs. Marie Hink and Mrs. Laura Tyler.

In 1866 she married Henry Broders of Springfield, Ill. Henry Broders served four years in the Civil war and fought in several hard battles. He died in 1900 aged 75 years. The children of this union are Henry Broders, Frances Schultz, deceased, Otto Broders and Anna Wickman.

Mrs. Broders passed away Tuesday, June 24, 1919, at 10:30 a.m., aged 84 years, four months and 18 days. The cause was Bright's disease. She was a hard working woman and one of the early settlers of our county. She was a member of the Trinity Lutheran church and helped in all enterprises financially until her death.

She leaves to mourn five living children: Mrs. Marie Hink, Mrs. Laura Tyler, Henry and Otto Broders and Anna Wickman. She left 30 grandchildren and 31 great-grandchildren.

Funeral services were conducted by Rev. O. Biermann at the home of Mrs. Henry Hink of Grinnell and at the country church on Thursday afternoon. She was interred on the lot at the side of Henry Broders, Sr., in

the Trinity Lutheran cemetery. The tuneral was largely attended by relatives and friends.

Pallbearers were the eldest son of each family.
