

Mary Killian Brown

Mary Killian Brown, 86, of 1322 West St., Grinnell, died of a stroke Thursday, Nov. 11, at Grinnell Regional Medical Center.

A memorial service will be held at 10:30 a.m. Friday at St. Paul's Episcopal Church. The Smith Funeral Home is in charge of arrangements.

She was born July 30, 1913, in Las Cruces, N.M., to Thomas T. and Henrietta Riggins Killian. She was raised in Southern California where she attended secondary school and later graduated from high school in Hemet, Calif.

She also attended Riverside Junior College in Riverside, Calif. She was a representative of the Diamond Walnut Co. at the World's Fair in San Francisco in 1939.

On Oct. 4, 1941, she was married to F. Andrew Brown in Berkeley, Calif. They lived in Ann Arbor, Mich., and Los Angeles before moving to Grinnell, where Mr. Brown was a member of the Grinnell College German faculty and Mrs. Brown was a homemaker.

She also resided with her family in Marburg and Munich, Germany, and Vienna, Austria, while her husband was on sabbatical leave from the college.

She was a member of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Entre Nous and the League of Women Voters. She also had served as an election official for several years.

Surviving are her husband; two sons, Steven of Iowa City and Terry of New York City; and one brother, Wiley Killian of Arizona.

She was preceded in death by her parents; one brother, Frank; and three sisters, Esther, Lucinda and Ruth.
