Lawrence Bryant.

The body of Lawrence Bryant, son of "En" Bryant, formerly a resident of Grinnell, was brought here on Friday night from Muscatine. On Saturday morning at 10 o'clock funeral services were held from the Friends church, conducted by Rev. Joseph Sopher and the body was taken to the Blue Point cemetery for interment.

Mr. Bryant met his death as a result of a crushing injury to the head. His body was found last week Sunday morning at 11 o'clock lying beside the railroad track. He lived until 9 o'clock on Wednesday night. There was talk of foul play in the case, but the coroner's jury was able to find no evidence to that effect. When last seen Bryant was cutting down corn in a field beside the railroad track. It is possible that he received his fatal injury in attempting to board a train. He is survived by a wife and one child. The family lived a few miles out of Muscatine and Mr. Bryant hired out by the day to work for farmers.
