Conrad Herman Henry Buchmeier, 78, of Kellogg died Saturday, June 9, at Grinnell General Hospital, where he had been a patient for four weeks.

The son of August and Dora Buckenthien Buchmeier, he was born May 31, 1895, in Rock Creek Township, Jasper County. He attended rural schools near his home. He was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith and was a lifetime member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Kellogg.

Mr. Buchmeier had farmed for many years northeast of Kellogg; in 1950 he moved to Kellogg to make his home. On July 8, 1930, he was married to Winema Couper. The couple had three children—Conrad H.H. Buchmeier Jr., who died as the result of an automobile accident in 1953; Ralph Laurence Buchmeier of Newton; and Mrs. John (Ruth) Bergstrom of Peoria, Ill.

He is survived by his wife; his children; five grandchildren, John Paul Bergstrom and Julie Ann Bergstrom of Peoria, and Curt, Caprice Ann and Camrae Buchmeier of Newton; and several cousins, nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by two brothers, John and Eddie Buchmeier; a sister in infancy; and a half-sister, Mrs. Edith Billiar.
