Eddie Buchmeier, Kellogg Farmer, Succumbs Tuesday

Eddie Walter Willie Buchmeier, 64, of Rte. 2, Kellogg, died at a Des Moines hospital Tuesday morning. He had been in failing health for some time.

Funeral services will be held at 1:30 p.m. Thursday from St. Paul's Lutheran church in Kellogg with the Rev. William G. Weber of Tama officiating.
