The Pacific Outlook, published in frants Pass, Oregon, has the following o say of the late Arthur Burroughs: Died in this city, Wednesday, May 11, 1919, Arthur W. Burroughs, aged about 35 years, of tuberculosis.

He was a most estimable Christia : coung ains, of a social and confactor. ture and though on account of the roubles and his quiet disposition he had not become prominent in the conmunity, he made many friends especially in the congregation of Berhany church, of which he and his wife were members. The esteem in which he was held was made manifest by the kindly tokens of friendship and sympathy shown during his last days, and by the wealth of beautiful floral offerings presented at the funeral. The funeral services were held at the home on Friday afternoon, Rev. Robt. Mc Lean, of Bethany, conducting and the interment was at Odd Fellows comtery. There the final sad rites were softened and beautified by the masses of flowers which the friends had strewn about the grave-mute emblens of the pure but flooring life that had just passed.
