
## **Robert Blakely**



Robert M. Blakely, 80, of College Station, Texas, a native of Grinnell, died Friday, March 1, at College Station Medical Center.

Services were conducted at the A&M United Methodist Church in College Station.

He was born Aug. 6, 1921, in Grinnell and was a graduate of Grinnell High School and Iowa State University. He served with the U.S. Marine Corps during World War II.

In 1949, Mr. Blakely returned to Grinnell to take over the family farm. In 1956, he and his family moved to the lower Rio Grande Valley in Texas and lived in Mission, Texas, where he worked in agricultural services until his retirement in 1989. In 1998, he moved with his wife, Doris, to College Station.

Robert McCool Blakely: 80, of College Station, Texas, formerly of Grinnell, died March 1.

A memorial service will be held at 2 p.m. Sunday, May 26, at the Grinnell United Methodist Church.

He was the son of A.J. Blakely Jr. and Sarah McCool Blakely and was born Aug. 6, 1921, in Grinnell. He was a graduate of Grinnell High School and Iowa State University.
