Mrs. Cafcules services held

Mercedes A. Cafcules, 53, of Rte. 1, Grinnell, died Sunday afternoon, Jan. 15, at Grinnell General Hospital.

Funeral services were conducted at 10:30 a.m. Wednesday at the United Church of Christ — Congregational. The Rev. Philip Ramstad officiated. Organist was Deanna Acrea, and soloist was Sherry Shults.

She was preceded in death by her father in 1979.
