Ray Cain Rites Held At Deep River

Funeral services for Charles Raymond Cain were conducted by the Rev. Leo Wilson at the Deep River Christian Church on Saturday afternoon, June 27. Music was provided by Mrs. Vaughn Icenbice.

Military rites were conducted by the Morrison Schrader Post 296 of the American Legion.

Mr. Cain, 66, died Wednesday, June 24.

The son of Charles and Bess Cain, he was born Sept. 12, 1903, at Montezuma. He attended school at Deep River and completed a course at

the Cedar Rapids Business College.

On Aug. 8, 1921, he was united in marriage to Velma Middlekauff and to this union one daughter, Betty, was born. They lived in Cedar Rapids for about ten years before moving to Deep River where he was associated with his father in a drug store.

He served as a pharmacist's mate in the Navy during World War II. He was a member of the American Legion and served as adjutant for Deep River and Dayton posts.

Survivors include his daughter Betty Keller of Deep River; three grandchildren, Kenneth and Joe Keller and Joan Wallace; three great-grandchildren; and one sister, Mrs. Melvin Elliott of Montezuma.
