## MARVIN CALDERWOOD

Marvin Calderwood was born in Brooklyn, July 29, 1920, to William and Mary Erickson Calderwood. He graduated from Brooklyn High School, and attended Morningside College in Sioux City. He then went to California and worked for Lockheed Aircraft, until he joined the Navy during World War II.

After the war he came back to Brooklyn. On December 7, 1947, he was united in marriage to Pauline Leeper in the home of the Rev. E. W. Farris Holler.

Marvin and Pauline had two sons, Willie and Andie. They lived on a farm north of Brooklyn. Later they moved to a farm near Malcom, and then they moved to Fifield, Wisc. Marvin and Pauline built a home in Fifield; Pauline died shortly after they moved into their new home.

Marvin continued to live in the home he and his wife had built. In July of this year he became ill. For the past month he has been in the Veteran's Hospital in Knoxville, Ia. There he died on December 23, 1988.

He joined the Presbyterian Church on June 7, 1936.

Marvin enjoyed the out-of-doors. He liked to hunt and fish. He was a good teacher and taught others about the out-of-doors, which he loved. He taught his mechanical skill to others.

Marvin was preceded in death by his parents, William and Mary; his wife Pauline; his sister Eloise, Mrs. John Elston; his brother Andrew; and his twin brother Matthew.

Marvin is survived by his son Willie, Willie's wife and son, Vinton; his son Andie, who lived with his father in Fifield, Wisc.; his sister Henrietta, Mrs. Walter Schwenk.

Marvin was a member of the Francis Gallagher Post of the American Legion. The memorial service in Brooklyn, Dec. 28, concluded with taps in his honor by the Francis Gallagher Post.
