Gerald Campbell killed in crash

Gerald Campbell, 35, of rural Gilman was killed early Thursday morning when he apparently lost control of his car at the intersection of Center and High streets in Gilman.

He was pronounced dead at the scene.

Authorities said the Campbell car reportedly was driving at a high rate of speed as he entered Gilman on Highway E-67 and failed to negotiate a curve. The car skidded into a ditch, struck a road sign, and hit several mailboxes and a utility pole.

Funeral services were held at 1:30 p.m. Saturday at the Estel-Perrin Chapel in Marshalltown, with burial at Rose Hill Memorial Gardens.

Survivors include his wife, <u>Ila</u>; a son, Russell Dale Ray; a daughter, Teresa; his parents, Mr. and Mrs.Dale Campbell of Gilman; five brothers and one

sister.

The son of Dale and Maxine Foreman Campbell, he was born Dec. 3, 1941, at Gilman. He attended the Laurel schools, graduating in 1960.

He was married to Ila Baldwin on Sept. 5, 1963. They had made their home in Gilman the past four years. Mr. Campbell was a truck driver for Arbie Feeds in Marshalltown.
