Luelda Carlton services held

Luelda Carlton, 95, of the Mayflower Home died Wednesday evening, Dec. 28, at the Mayflower health Care Center.

Services were held at 10:30 a.m. Saturday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Robert I. Stone of Mason City officiating. Organist was Alice Renaud.

The daughter of the Rev. V. Albert and Addie Lambert Carlton, she was born June 1, 1893, in Lisbon, Iowa. She moved with her family to Toledo. She graduated from Hampton High School in 1910, attended Leander Clark College in Toledo, and received her bachelor's degree from Coe College in 1917 and her master's degree in literature from the University of Wisconsin in 1927.

Miss Carlton had taught high school English in West Side and Harlan before joining the faculty of Mason City Community College where she taught from 1927 through 1965. During World War II she served as acting dean of the college.

She was active in Mason City community affairs. She was a member of the First Congregational-UCC Church, the American Association of University Women, PEO, Delta Kappa Gamma, the Browning Society and the Retired Teachers Association. She moved to the Mayflower Home five years ago.

There are no immediate survivors. She was preceded in death by her parents and two sisters, Ione Carlton Lee and Leda Carlton.
