The daughter of James and Mary Ann Baker Dryden, she was born Nov. 27, 1901, near Fairfield in Wayne County, Ill. She attended school in Janesville, Ill., and Eastern Illinois State Normal School in Charleston. She received her B.A. degree from the University of Illinois in 1924. She taught at Oak Park and Kankakee, Ill., and at Eastern Illinois Normal School.

She was married to Gage Griffin Carman June 9, 1926, in Janesville. They lived in Kansas City, Mo., before moving to Grinnell in 1966.

Mrs. Carman was a member of the Grinnell United Church of Christ — Congregational, the League of Women Voters, Entre Nous and the Association of University Women. She served for 12 years on the Grinnell United Way board of directors and also was a member of the Friends of Art at Nelson-Atkins Museum in Kansas City. While at the University of

Illinois, she was elected to Phi Beta Kappa, Sigma Xi and Pi Mu Epsilon honorary societies.

There are no immediate survivors. She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband; one brother, James W. Dryden; and two half-brothers, Albert W. and John L. Dryden.
