## Conduct Funeral Services Saturday For Ed Carnes, 74

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon from the Smith Funeral Home for Ed Carnes, 74, of Grinnell, who died Wednesday at an Iowa City hospital.

Officiating at the service was the Rev. Chester Custer, pastor of the Methodist church. Organ music was provided by Mrs. Willard Heffner.

Pallbearers were Mike Brooks, Tom Sanders, Lester Adkins, Bill Flaherty, Henry Selle and Raymond Norris. Burial was in Woodland cemetery at Lynnville with graveside rites conducted by Commander Jack Day and members of the Grinnell American Legion ceremonial unit.

Born Oct. 5th, 1890, at Spencerville, Ind., he was the son of Jerry and Ella Miller Carnes. He attended the Spencerville public schools and later graduated from high school at Long Beach, Calif. He then returned to Indiana where he graduated from Indiana University.

During World War I he served with the armed forces and on Dec. 30th, 1919, at Des Moines, was united in marriage with Mabel Elizabeth Arthur.

Survivors include his wife, Mabel, at the home in Grinnell; and two sisters, Mrs. Josephine Shuff and Mrs. Harold Blackmun, both of Niles, Mich.; and several nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his parents and one brother, Homer.

Following his military service, he lived in Des Moines, in Florida, and at Niles, Mich., before moving to Grinnell about eight years ago.

He was employed with the A. J. Boreman Co. as an advertising salesman, and was a member of Focht-Tennant Post No. 53 of the American Legion and Hopeful Barracks, World War I Veterans organization, both of Grinnell.
