**Neva Wymore Carr
Memorial Service
Conducted Dec. 24**

Neva, daughter of Andrew and Evah Wymore, was born three miles west of Barnes City, Oct. 30, 1878, and died at the Mahaska hospital, Oskaloosa, Dec. 21, at 85 years of age.

In her youth, she attended rural school. In September, 1897, she was united in marriage with Joseph Carr. To this union, seven children were born, one son, Elmo, died in infancy.

The Carrs spent their entire married life in or near Barnes City with the exception of a few years spent in Missouri.

After the death of Mr. Carr in 1947, she maintained her home until two years ago, when she entered a nursing home. About 10 years ago, she was immersed in the faith of the Christian church in Barnes City.

She is survived by her children, Lewis, of Lansing, Ill; Walter, of Decatur, Ill; Hazel Mc Clelland, of Emmetsburg, Iowa; Sara Mc Clure, Montezuma; Thomas Carr and Elma Nanke, both of What Cheer; also 18 grandchildren, several great grandchildren, other relatives and many friends.

Memorial services were conducted at 1:30 p.m. Dec. 24, at the Barnes City Christian church by the Rev. Mr. James Imlay, of What Cheer Baptist church. Leslie Steele, accompanied by Mrs. Wm. Landstrum, sang "In The Garden."
