## LIVED ALMOST ENTIRE LIFE IN THIS COUNTY

Funeral Services Were Held Thursday for John C. Creamer.

Funeral services for John C. Creamer, who passed away Tuesday at his home in Gilman, were conducted at 10:30 o'clock Thursday morning from the Catholic church in this city, by Rev. Father M. J. The death of Col. Creamer closed a life which had been spent almost entirely in Poweshiek County.

He spent his entire life in and near Grinnell, and for many years was prominent as an auctioneer.
