

Services Held for Emo

Services were held Aug. 22 at the Church of Christ, Deep River, for Emery Cheney, a long-time resident of Deep River and area.

Emery Addison, son of Amasa and Cindy Scott Cheney, was born near Millersburg on Oct. 9, 1869, and passed away at the home of his son Vern Aug. 20. He was 90 years, 10 months and 11 days old at the time of his death.

On May 3, 1894, he was united in marriage to Clara Tinkle at Millersburg. To this union five children were born including three daughters and two sons. One daughter died in infancy.

In 1907 the Cheneys moved from Millersburg to a farm near Deep River. They continued to farm there until they moved to what was their permanent home in Deep River in 1943.

Mr. Cheney was a member of the Protestant Methodist Church, Millersburg, and was united with the Church of Christ, Deep River, in 1914. He was a faithful member of the church.

He is survived by two sons, Cloyd, Davenport, and Vern. Deep River, and one daughter, Mrs. Irma Briggs, Kansas City, Mo. Other survivors are nine grandchildren and seventeen great-grandchildren; two sisters, Letha King, Blairstown, and Alta Ficsh, Kcs-wich; and one brother, Willis, Deep River; and several nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his wife, one daughter, Iva, his parents, three sisters and three brothers.

Final services Aug. 22 at Deep River were conducted by the Rev. Ted Warren, assisted by W. Dean Mason, grandson of Cheney.
