Clinton Centennial Child, son of Mr Aldace W. Child, was born in Grinnell July 4th, 1876. He received his education in the public schools of Grinnel and Iowa College and in the Easter. College of Business at Pcughkeepsie N. Y.

Returning from the East in 1896 he was associated with his uncle, A. L. Child, for several years as a photographer. Afterwards he engaged in the lumber business, at New Sharon, and later in Minnescta, until 1902, when he entered the employ of the Monarch Lumber Co. and removed to Blaine, Washington.

His pleasing personality, integrity and business ability were soon recognized by his employers and his advancement was rapid. At the time of his death, he was manager of the Lester W. David, and Monarch Lumber Companies, of Portland, Ore., holding a considerable interest in each concern.
