

FUNERAL OF FRANK CHILD ON TUESDAY

Longtime Grinnell Resident Passed Away

Frank L. Child, long time resident of Grinnell, passed away at his home, 621 Broad street, Sunday morning at 6:10 o'clock. He had been in poor health for the last three years but his last illness was of only twelve days' duration. He was 78 years old.

Funeral services will be held from the Congregational church at 3 o'clock Tuesday afternoon, conducted by Rev. Robert Inglis. Burial will be in Hazelwood cemetery.

Mr. Child was born in Bath, N. H., Dec. 31, 1858. He spent his early life in Bath and came to Iowa in 1886, locating in Grinnell. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Dudley Child, came about the same time. Dudley Child was a brother of Jonathan Child, who was the father of Aldace and A. L. Child. All came from the same neighborhood in New Hampshire, the group also including the Bartlett, Walker, Morrison and Sutherland families.

In the fall of the same year Mr. Child returned to New England and was married at St. Johnsbury, Vt., to Miss Mary E. Stockwell, who passed away in 1907. In 1913 he married Mrs. Helen C. Rundell, who survives him. To his first marriage two children were born, Carl E. Child of this city, and Wallace, who died in 1920.

Mr. Child was engaged in various business activities in Grinnell, where he made his home constantly except for a period of about 11 years, during which he was in the restaurant business in Osceola. He returned to Grinnell in 1925 and has been here ever since.

Mr. Child was a man of genial nature who made friends quickly and kept them long. During his declining years he has been an assistant in the Poweshiek National Bank, where his son Carl is vice president, and his cordial greeting and courteous assistance have been appreciated by the patrons of the bank. Whatever he did he did with his whole heart and he will be missed from the streets which he has walked for so many years.
