Sally Cleaver, 64, died Friday evening at her home of cancer.

Following her graduation she joined the staff of the Jackson (Miss.) Daily News where she had been employed as a student. During this period she was active in the interracial work of the Regional Council.

She was married to <u>Charles Grinnell Cleaver</u> on Aug. 25, 1948, in Jackson and they resided in Atlanta, Ga.; Cincinnati, Ohio; Minneapolis, Minn.; Tokyo, Japan; and Honolulu, Hawaii, as well as Grinnell, while Mr Cleaver pursued the career of college professor of English.

In Minneapolis and Cincinnati she worked for the Planned Parenthood Federation as her placement by the Junior League. In Grinnell she was a founder and member of the board of directors of the Poweshiek County Mental

Health Center; was a member of the League of Women Voters and its study committee which resulted in the new Poweshiek County Care Facility; the Iowa Association for Mental Health from which she received its Gold Bell Award; the Iowa Mental Health Commission; a volunteer and board member of Hospice Grinnell; National Organization of Women; The Elizabeth Earle Magoun Club and St. Paul's Episcopal Church.

She is survived by her husband Charles, Grinnell; one daughter Ann Jessup Cleaver Bailey, Port Townsend, Wash.; a son Richard Grinnell Cleaver, Ypsilanti, Mich.; and a brother Dr. Richard D. Dever, Jacksonville, Fla.
