## Funeral Services Set Tuesday For Jack Clifford, 78

John Edwin (Jack) Clifford, 78, well-known Grinnell barber, died early Saturday morning at a local hospital following an illness of the past 15 months.

Funeral services will be held at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday from the Smith Funeral Home with the Rev. Kenneth Pohlenz, pastor of the First Friends church, officiating. Organ music will be by Mrs. Kathleen Heffner.

Pallbearers will be Jerry Carter, Wendell Terrell, Don Sparks, Walto McGriff, Willie Morrison and Frank Brown. Burial will be in Hazelwood cemetery.

He was the son of Ace and Lizzie Glover Clifford and was born Nov. 10th, 1883, at Menlo. He graduated from Menlo high school and then attended the Des Moines Barber College.

Mr. Clifford had been a barber for 59 years. He had a shop in Des Moines for many years and then moved to Grinnell 35 years ago. He had been located in his shop at 703 West St. for 31 years.

On May 12th, 1913, he was united in marriage with Katherine Frost at Princeton, Mo.

Survivors include his wife; two children, Edwin A. Clifford of Miami, Fla., and Mrs. Paul (Louise) Weber of Grinnell; three stepchildren, Mrs. Esther Fleener and Mrs. Merlin (Leona) Rice, both of Grinnell, and Harold McLish of Waterloo; and seven grandchildren and six great grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents, one brother and one sister, and a step-daughter, Mrs. Lela Wilson in 1942.
