Rescuers said that all three of the men were wearing life jackets when the boat overturned. Edward was trapped under the overturned boat. His unconscious father was found and pulled to the surface by Robert, who managed to hold him there until a nearby fisherman arrived at the disaster scene.

Revival Efforts Fail

Rescue squad from the Rock Island Police Department was dispatched to the area and worked over the two men for about a half-hour after they were taken to shore. However, efforts to revive the two were
