

## James Cogley

James Cogley, 58, of Maxwell, formerly of Grinnell, died of complications from pancreatitis Saturday, Aug. 3, following three months of hospitalization at Suburban Hospital in Bethesda, Md.

Private family services were conducted Thursday at the Smith Funeral Home. Personal remarks were delivered by Phillip Loiterstein of Washington, D.C., and James Copeland of Jefferson.

The son of John Luke and Clara Evelyn Figland Cogley, he was born Dec. 24, 1932, in Grinnell. He graduated from Grinnell High School in 1950 and received his B.S. degree in mathematics from Iowa State University in 1954. While at Iowa State, he was a member of R.O.T.C. Following his graduation, he served as a lieutenant with the U.S. Army for two years at Fort Huachuca, Ariz.

Mr. Cogley was employed by the Rand Corporation and worked in Boston and Kansas City before moving to the Los Angeles area where he worked for System Development Corporation. In 1970 he became co-owner of Group Operations Inc., a computer consultant firm in Washington D.C. After retiring in 1986, he purchased a home in Maxwell where he was a member of the American Legion.

Surviving are his mother, Clara Cogley of Grinnell; four brothers, Clarence of Grinnell, Dr. Keith of Colfax, Dr. Allen of Manhattan, Kan., and Dr. Roy of McClelland; and eight sisters, Betty Brian of Davenport, Eleanor Mason of Tama, Bernice Mithelman of Grinnell, Avis Kelm of Malcom, Joan Hopkinson of Grinnell, Barbara Danskin of Scottsdale, Ariz., Marilyn Copeland of Jefferson and Patricia Lang of Grinnell. He was preceded in death by his father.
