

IS INSTANTLY KILLED

Mrs. J. S. Coleman, a Milliner of
Brooklyn Meets Death in Des

Moines

IS STRUCK BY TRUCK
WHICH RAN OVER CURB

Was Thrown Violently to the Side-
walk by Impact of the
Collision

Mrs. J. S. Coleman, 32 years old, a milliner in business in Brooklyn, was instantly killed in Des Moines early Wednesday afternoon when she was run down by a Lozier Floral Company truck which escaped from the control of its driver and mounted the sidewalk at the corner of Seventh and Pleasant street. Mrs. Coleman was in company with Mrs. L. G. Ruebottom of Osceola, who was slightly injured. The two women were in Des Moines buying supplies for the store in Brooklyn. Mrs. Coleman was thrown to the sidewalk by the impact of the truck and was instantly killed. Mrs. Ruebottom stepped to one side and was only slightly hurt.

Ray Beegan, the driver of the truck, was placed under arrest and a charge of manslaughter will be lodged against him.
